Did you know around six to 10 per cent of new breast cancer cases are metastatic?

Metastatic means cancer cells have spread to other parts of the body—often to the woman's bones, liver, lungs and brain.

Important breast cancer signs and symptoms:

- New lumps or thickening in the breast, especially if in only one breast
- Nipple sores or change in shape of the nipple
- Nipple discharge or turning in
- · Changes in the size or shape of the breast
- · Skin of the breast dimpling
- · Discomfort or swelling in the armpit
- · Rash or red swollen breasts
- Ongoing pain that is not related to your menstrual cycle that remains after your period and occurs in only one breast.
